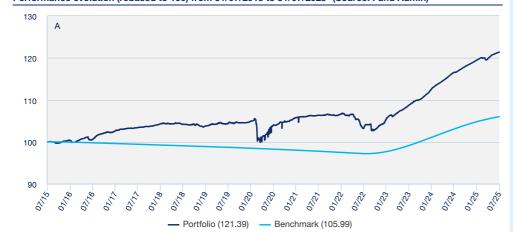

Management commentary

The month of July 2025 was marked by persistent uncertainty in the financial markets, amplified by heightened trade and geopolitical tensions. In the eurozone, inflation reached 2% yearon-year, slightly higher than the previous month (1.9%) and close to the European Central Bank (ECB) target. The labor market remained dynamic with the creation of 1.8 million jobs and an unemployment rate stable at 6.2%. The eurozone's economic growth increased by 0.1% in the second quarter compared to the previous quarter. In light of these figures and global uncertainties, the ECB kept its rates unchanged, adopting a wait-and-see stance. In the United States, inflation rose to 2.7%, exceeding forecasts, while economic growth surprised positively with an annualized increase of 3% in the second quarter, after a contraction in the previous quarter. These figures were influenced by new tariff measures from Donald Trump, which altered consumer behavior, notably through massive imports in anticipation of tariffs. A major event was the trade agreement reached on July 27 between the United States and the European Union, setting a base tariff rate of 15% on certain products, with sectoral exemptions, which helped reduce market uncertainty. The agreed base tariff rate of 15% for most European products is a positive development for the markets, notably because it avoids the worst-case scenario of an escalation of retaliatory measures. The level of uncertainty has decreased, but there are still specific sectoral rates to be disclosed.

The beginning of July was dynamic for the European securitization market, mainly driven by robust demand for UK RMBS and a significant pipeline of primary CLO issuances. The month began with a significant influx of CLO transactions and four ABS deals were successfully issued, supported by tightening spreads reflecting strong investor appetite. Then, over the course of the month, the market saw a diverse range of transactions, including several auto leasing deals and ABS, highlighted by the launch of a Swiss auto leasing ABS incorporating a euro currency swap—an innovative addition enhancing the sector's diversity.

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Despite the traditional summer slowdown, the CLO market demonstrated its resilience, maintaining steady activity throughout July. While ABS issuance gradually declined, culminating in an almost complete pause at the end of the month—with only a single French RMBS transaction retained by the issuer—the CLO segment continued to thrive. Four transactions were completed in the third week and four more in the fourth week, bringing issuances above July 2024 levels.

Regarding fund management, we participated in several primary transactions, notably financing auto loans in Italy granted by Hyundai Bank, and consumer loans in France originated by BNP Personal Finance. We also participated in the Swiss auto leasing transaction. We were also opportunistic in the secondary CLO market to strengthen our positions in relatively short mezzanine tranche profiles.

Finally, we also reduced our protection, as concerns about the expiration of the US tariff negotiation period dissipated as various agreements were reached between the US administration and its trading partners over the course of the month.

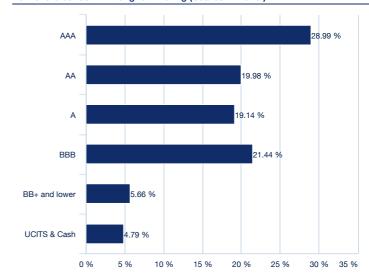

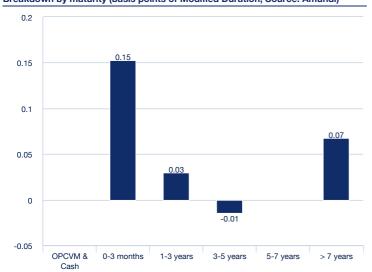
Portfolio breakdown - Long term rating (Source: Amundi)



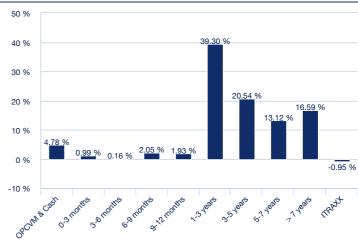

Breakdown by maturity (basis points of Modified Duration, Source: Amundi)

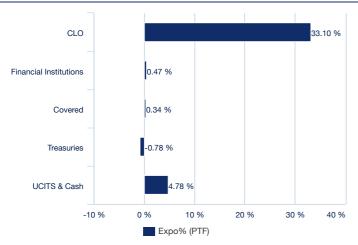


Portfolio breakdown by maturity (Source: Amundi)

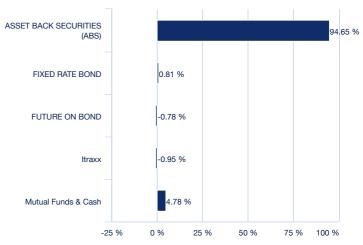

SRI Terminology

Socially Responsible Investment (SRI)

The SRI expresses sustainable development objectives in investment decisions by adding Environmental, Social and Governance (ESG) criteria in addition to the traditional financial criteria.

SRI thus aims to balance economic performance and social and environmental impact by financing companies and public entities which contribute to sustainable development whatever their business sector. By influencing the governance and behaviour of stakeholders, SRI promotes a responsible economy.

ESG criteria

The criteria are extra-financial criteria used to assess the Environmental, Social and Governance practices of companies, states or local authorities:

- "E" for Environment (energy and gas consumption levels, water and waste management, etc.).
- "S" for Social/Society (respect for human rights, health and safety in the workplace, etc.).
- "G" for Governance (independence of board of directors, respect for shareholders' rights, etc.)

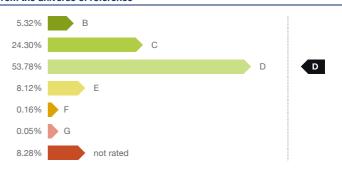
AVERAGE ESG RATING (source : Amundi)

Focus on Environmental, Social and Governance key performance indicators

In addition to the overall ESG assessment of the portfolio and the E, S and G dimensions, the manager uses impact indicators to assess the ESG quality of his portfolio. Four representative indicators of Environment, Social, Human Rights and Governance have been identified. The manager's minimum objective is to deliver a quality score higher than that of the index on at least two of the indicators.

For these 4 indicators, the total for the portfolio/investment universe is equal to the companies' average for these indicators adjusted for their weight in the portfolio/investment universe.

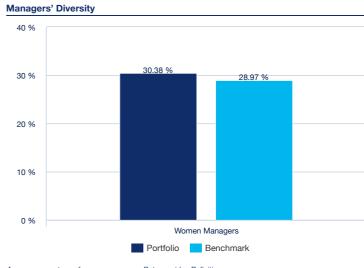

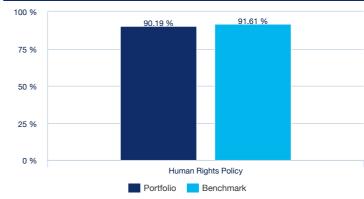
Board Independence Percentage

Sources and definitions

This data is provided by Trucost, This corresponds to companies' annual greenhouse gas emissions expressed in metric tons of carbon dioxide equivalent. (CO2e). It covers the six greenhouse gases identified in the Kyoto Protocol with emissions converted into global warming potential (GWP) in CO2 equivalent.

Definition of scopes:

- Scope 1: All direct emissions from sources that are owned or controlled by a company.
- Scope 2: All indirect emissions arising from the purchase or production of electricity, steam or heat.
- Scope 3: All other indirect emissions, upstream and downstream of the value chain. For reasons of data robustness, Amundi has chosen to use emissions from activities upstream of Scope 3
